Recently Brian (ZL2CHV) and myself went up to the Mt Climie repeater site for the spring inspection, we fared quite well over the winter with no indications of leaking or rodent infestation.

We attached “Buried Cables” signs to the poles to warn contractors to be careful with their machinery.

The main reason for our visit was to see what we need to do in order to relocate the 730 equipment to the North Hut, one possible plan would be to install a second 19 inch rack and shift the 1292 gear into it, allowing all the 730 gear (repeater, filters, batteries etc) to go into its own rack..

Prior to this we need to make sure that the earthing set-up is all in order with new earth stakes and cables.

Our repeater trustees are considering a change to the 1292 set-up which will make the repeater more useable in the DX world.

Brian – ZL2CHV continues to host radio and stargazing sessions at the Glider Club at Kaitoke , and David ZL2DRM is carrying out testing of a number of HF antennas over at Kaitoke Regional Park – watch the club’s Facebook page for notification of times.
